

Quick Guide: Integrating Yellow Flag Themes with the Primary Curriculum

SUBJECT	INTEGRATING YELLOW FLAG THEMES IN THE PRIMARY CURRICULUM
Wellbeing	Promotes wellbeing in each of the key areas: environment, curriculum and learning, policy and planning and partnerships
Visual Arts	Exploring themes through drawing, paint, colour, print, clay, construction
English, Gaelige	Exploring culture and identity through language, sourcing texts from diverse cultural contexts, learning the correct register for different cultural contexts, making comparisons with our own culture and language, developing empathy with non-native speakers
Geography	Exploring human environments
SPHE	Myself, Myself and others, Myself and the wider world
Music	Listening and responding, performing in a variety of cultural styles
Drama	Exploring and reflecting on the themes through drama, to express feelings, knowledge and ideas
History	Exploring cultural histories through story; politics, conflict and society; continuity and change over time
Maths	Analysis of figures from the Intercultural Review, human rights data, data from the evaluation of events
PE	Exploring different cultural forms of dance, games, sports and movement, fair play, communicating and working in groups, developing self-esteem, respecting others' views
Science	Identifying our common humanity - that we are one race. Our common human needs and how these are reflected in human rights. Identifying the positive and negative impacts of science on humanity
