How your school can showcase its work

All schools want to put their best foot forward when preparing for a visit from the assessment committee. Here are some suggestions on how you can prepare...

- Get your Yellow Flag folder in order – think about ways you can demonstrate the obvious and more hidden work¹ you have done as part of the Yellow Flag
- Arrange for the link teacher and student/s to escort the assessment team on a tour of the school
- Get the Diversity Committee to make a presentation, with different students talking about different aspects of your work:
 - Student 1:** How the Diversity committee worked, when you met, what you did at meetings
 - Student 2:** The Intercultural Review, what you did, what you found out
 - Student 3:** Making the action plan, actions you carried out, highlights and challenges²
 - Person 4:** How you made the diversity code
 - Person 5:** Changes your school has made to respond to racism and create a more equal environment
- Arrange for some parents, staff and the Principal to meet with the assessment team
- Arrange to call in on a class - where class members can talk about their experience of the programme in your school and their knowledge on interculturalism
- Maybe you can think of other ways your school can showcase its work!
- Use the self-evaluation form to help you prepare and don't be afraid to talk about the challenges or obstacles you faced

¹Sometimes 'hidden work' can be the most important – e.g. relationships you have quietly been building, knowledge you have gained, classroom norms you have changed.

²Sometimes problems you have faced, and how you are addressing them, is the best way of showing how you have grown as an intercultural school
